STUDENTS NEED TO BRING A WATER BOTTLE EACH DAY I would like to welcome back the Nicholson School Community to the 2022-2023 school year. The school staff were very excited to see all of the students return and re-engage in learning together. There is a bit of a nip in the air in the mornings, please check that your children are dressed for the weather as they leave for school as many of our classes enjoy spending extra time outside during this beautiful time of year.

Friday, September 23rd will be our Terry Fox Run. Our goal is to raise \$200 to support cancer research and we are asking each student to donate \$2 if they are able. The whole school will be outside walking or running to continue to support the Terry Fox Foundation.

The beginning of the year is the best time to establish the expectations and routines for the school year. Supporting your children in arriving to school ahead of the school day scarting, helps them to transition into the classroom and highlights the importance of being on time and ready to learn. Our first bell rings at 8:40 am. We ask that students being dropped off, riding their bikes or walking, arrive at school after 8:30 am.

I would like to welcome our new staff members this year. Ms. Genevieve Allen, who is teaching in the Grade 3/4 classrooms until Spring Break and Mrs. Theressa Gelette who is temporarily in the Administrative Assistant position.

My role as the principal is to help create and support an environment where every child feels safe, happy, connected and supported so that their learning can continue to grow. If you are **dropping off lunch or backpack**, please bring it to the front office.






# Terry Fox Run Friday September 23th


