It's Tick Season



- Know where to expect ticks. Many areas in the good ground cover and diverse wildlife (such as squirrels, hedgehogs, birds and deer) can pose a potential risk as wildlife feeds any ticks and allows their population to increase. Animals also transport ticks to new areas.
- 2. Use a repellent, reading the instructions carefully. There is currently no vaccine to defend against Lyme disease so prevention is key.
- 3. Tuck your trouser legs into your socks. This helps to deter ticks from crawling inside your pant legs, down into shoes and through most socks. Wearing gaiters will also help to prevent this.
- Check your body carefully for ticks after being outdoors taking special care to check all over the body. Ticks prefer 4. warm, moist, dark areas of the body.
- 5. Don't bring ticks home. Check clothing and pets for ticks to avoid bringing them inside.
- 6. If you do find a tick, carefully remove it by using a specialist tick-removal tool or fine-tipped tweezers.




